Dear parent or guardian,

Issue of results

Results dates are: AS and A Level: Thursday 14 August GCSE: Thursday 21 August

Pupils awaiting AS and A Level results can access them remotely using the PIN they have been advised of previously.

A Level results: Results will be available in the Assembly Hall from 08:30 for pupils who want to call and of course anyone who requires advice or assistance should call and seek it as early in the day as possible. More specific information about the day will be posted as a reminder on social media in mid August.

AS results: Results will be distributed in the Assembly Hall from 10:00. Year 13 pupils moving into Year 14 should call at school between 10:00 and 12:00 to confirm subject choices. <u>Pupils</u> who do not need to drop a subject and do not require assistance with an issue do not have to <u>attend school.</u> Pupils who are unable to call but who wish to drop a subject should telephone school with their information.

GCSE results: These can be collected at the Assembly Hall from 08:30, staff will be on hand to deal with any issues or queries. At this point pupils may also confirm subject choices.

Please be mindful that results days are very busy in school and results cannot ordinarily be given over the phone.

Bus Passes and Transport Claims

Home to school transport assistance must be applied for through the Education Authority (EA) online application process. Please note the school is not involved in this process and has no involvement in the granting of transport assistance. School uniform

As you know high standards of appearance, behaviour and attainment are expected of pupils of the Royal School. We are pleased that high standards are the norm however we ask for your particular assistance in ensuring the following in line with the appearance code:

- **Skirts** worn at the knee and not 'rolled up' at the waist. Please take time over the summer to make sure that skirts are compliant with school regulations, these have not changed in recent years and therefore we ask for continued cooperation
- *Hair* tidy style, a natural colour with the avoidance of 'extremes' in style. Boys' hair should not be worn lower than collar length. Boys should not have shaved heads or very short cuts e.g. 'number 1'. There is an expectation that boys will be clean shaven

- *Make up* this must be discreet if it can be easily seen its not discreet enough and pupils are liable to be asked to remove it
- **Shoes** shoes are expensive, and we do not want anyone to have to buy a second pair, they should be plain black leather only, no trainers or canvas shoes and no white soles. Girls shoes must have low heels
- **Piercings** one stud only may be worn in each ear lobe by girls only. Nose piercings and multiple ear piercings are not permitted
- *Nail varnish* permitted in subdued/neutral colours only
- Gel nails etc. these are not permitted
- Hoodies only the official school hoodie may be worn under blazers to and from school and only as part of the full uniform and in periods of cold weather. They may not be worn in corridors unless as part of the official PE uniform. We are pleased that each year a number of teams or trips produce tops with the school crest or team name as a memento of pupil involvement. However, please bear in mind that these tops are not part of the school uniform and may not be worn as such
- Pupils must change back into their full uniform after games classes before leaving the school grounds.

Further information about appearance, including information about hairstyles, is contained in the Parents' Handbook which is available on the school website.

School Shop

Items of uniform may be purchased from the school shop. Throughout the summer it will be open each day from 9am to 4:30pm (Closed for lunch 12:30pm to 1pm). The shop will be closed from Monday 14 – Friday 18 July (inclusive).

Lunchtime

- We will operate a service in the Dining Hall from 28 August. There will be a more limited selection to begin with until we establish demand;
- As you would expect vegetarian, gluten free and halal options (where requested) will be available from 28 August;
- The biometric (fingerprint) payment system will be used;
- We regret that it will not be possible to provide food to a pupil who has no credit on their account. It is vital that parents and pupils ensure they have sufficient credit in their account to ensure they can avail of a healthy meal. An automatic top up facility is available on ParentPay which will ensure pupils have credit on their card.
